For and in consideration of the sum of Twelve Dollars and fifty Cents to me in hand paid for the use and benefit of the Corporation of Nashville by Frank Parrish the receipt where of is hereby acknowledged I Martin C. Cotton Agent & Superintendant (sic) of the Nashville Cemetery by virtue of athority (sic) in me vested have bargained sold and by these present doth convey to him the said Frank Parrish his heirs and assigns for ever a certain Lot piece or parcel of ground Lying & being in the Nashville Cemetery situate at the south side of Cherry avenue and west from City avenue Extended Beginning at a stake at the south side of Cherry avenue Running thence south twenty five feet to a stake thence east ten feet to a stake at D. F. Carter's south west corner thence North with his Line twenty five feet to a stake at the south side of Cherry avenue thence west ten feet with the south side of said avenue (*blotted*) to the beginning Containing two Hundred and fifty feet superficial measure at 5 cents per foot. \$12.50

To have and to hold to him the said Frank Parrish his heirs and assigns for ever a certain lot piece or parcel of ground in the Nashville Cemetery for the special use and purpose of a burying ground and for no other purpose or occupancy whatever given under my hand and seal at office in the City of Nashville this the 29th day of May 1856 Martin C. Cotton, Agent
